Oranjemund Wins Big at the Namibia Tourism Expo

At the recent NTE, the Oranjemund town exhibit won a silver award. The event is held annually by Namibia Media Holdings. The silver award was given based on the attractiveness or warmth of the stall and the engagement with people throughout the three-day event.

This year our theme was based around the unique mystery surrounding our beautiful town – *Namibia's Best Kept Secret*.

Moreover, after the opening of our town in 2017, hospitality and tourism were identified as the key areas for the economic growth within the Oranjemund Town Transformation strategy. Thus, to promote the town and drive home the message that Oranjemund is an ideal business and tourist destination, the three major town transformation stakeholders, Oranjemund Town Council, OMDis, and OMD 2030 attended the 2022 NTE.

Eco Awards

Eco Awards Namibia is an internationally acclaimed organization which offers a sustainable tourism education and accreditation programe.

In 2020, Oranjemund was the first town ever to undergo an environmental sustainability audit and was the first to receive an environmental sustainability accreditation.

This year three Oranjemund Schools – !Garibams Secondary School, Amobrosius Amutenya Primary School and Oranjemund Private School participated in the audit earlier this year with Eco Awards Namibia who added new schools criteria to their assessment process.

Oranjemund was the first ever town/ municipal area to undergo an environmental audit, the town audit together with the recent school's audit was championed by OMD 2030.

During the recent Namibia Tourism Expo. Twenty-two certificates were awarded to different tourism establishments by the Ministry of Environment, Forestry and Tourism's Director.

Eight of these were the highest awarded category: the Five Green Flowers category which gives special recognition to establishments who scored 5 flowers overall, and in addition, scored 90% or more in four of the environmental criteria sections i.e., *Water, Energy, Waste Management and Conservation.*

Ambrosius Amutenya Primary school was awarded 5 Green Flowers, followed by Oranjemund Private School who received 4 Flowers, and !Garibams Secondary School who received 2 Flowers.

These sessions are designed to help the teenagers live their best lives, and to thrive, not just survive despite obstacles that they meet on the way.

The first three workshops covered topics such as: who am I, the labels I give myself and goal setting.

Recycling Figures 2022

These are the collective recycling figures for the total weight recycled for this year.

This is also the first year we have included E-waste into our recycling at the OMD 2030 Hub.

The total recycled for 2021 was **3.2 tonnes**, and the total recycled for 2022 this far excluding the month of December is standing at **3.3 tonnes**.

These are all the different locations where you can find a recycling centre in town - OMD 2030, Oranjemund Private School and Ambrosius Amutenya Primary School.
