
Unfortunately, seven applicants had to withdraw due to unforeseen circumstances, but many have expressed their eagerness to rejoin in the next competition!

The competition runs from 3 February to 30 April 2025, giving participants time to improve their gardens even more. At the end, a winner will be chosen by a team of judges, including experts from OMDis Nursery, OTC Parks & Gardens, and a local community member.

This competition is about more than just plants—it's about bringing people together, sharing ideas, and creating a town we can all be proud of.

With such a positive response, we hope to make this a regular event to keep the community engaged and inspired!





Sustainability Pratices

Recycling plays a crucial role in decreasing pollution, mitigating global warming, and conserving energy, materials, and natural resources. Our waste is systematically categorized into several groups, including Plastic, Paper, Refuse-Derived Fuel (RDF), Glass, and Cans.

We encourage individuals/community members to contribute to environmental preservation by properly separating their waste.




Did You Know?

In 1956, a monthly newsletter was started by Oranjemund local and former mine General Manager Stan Devlin. The newsletter encouraged sharing of news as well as opinions among town residents.

It also acted as a communication network between residents and CDM. The newsletter went through various stylistic changes over the years. Early issues were called the "Oranjemund Newsletter" and were later published as the "Sperrgebiet Gazette".

In recent years, the newsletter became a weekly publication, and was produced regularly until November 2008.
